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## On-Campus Library Services for the Fall Semester



[Masks covering the nose and mouth](#) are required for anyone on Durham Tech campuses.

When possible, the Main Campus Library will be open Monday through Thursday during the fall semester. The Orange County Campus will have limited hours as well. Hours may change; check [the library homepage](#) for the most up-to-date hours. Contact the library to

arrange for services outside the current schedule.

When the library is open, we will need to maintain physical distancing to keep everyone safe, so if you can ask online, please do. We have designated study spaces while we're open, but current health guidelines encourage short trips.

**Need to return a book or DVD?** We have two outdoor return boxes [on Main Campus](#)—one is outside the building doors to Building 5 and the other one is in the traffic circle near the flagpole (Parking Lot C).

**Want to check out a book?** Email the library and we'll arrange for checkout and pickup at the Main Campus Library. This includes ILL and books from other campus libraries.

**Need to put a textbook on reserve for student use?** Drop it off at the Main Campus Library. After use, books will be quarantined for 3 days, so encourage students to call or email before coming to make sure their textbook is available. If students need to rent or buy a textbook to use at home for the entire semester, have them contact the bookstore.

## Have a student who needs a laptop or internet access?

Do you have a student in your class who is completing their coursework on their cellphone or who is having trouble with at-home internet access?

Check out the Durham Tech [Computer and Internet Assistance for Students during COVID-19](#) page. After students complete the form linked on the previous page, students will be contacted by Maggie West, Coordinator of Student Wellness and Basic Needs, to review their application.

If they qualify, they can check out a Chromebook laptop for the semester and be connected to low-cost internet options. They may also qualify for a low-cost computer or technology scholarship.

[National](#) and [statewide studies](#) show a high correlation between student success and library usage, so help promote student success by partnering with your librarians **through library instruction and assignment consultations.**

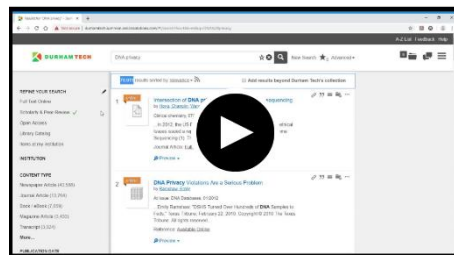
