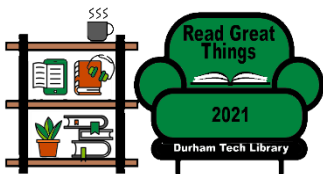

Making the Most of your Library

[National](#) and [state-wide studies](#) show a high correlation between student success and library usage, so remember to reach out to your Durham Tech librarians with your research and “how do I use this?” questions.

Librarians can help you learn more about information literacy, effective search strategies in databases and on the internet, selecting college- and subject-appropriate resources, evaluating and understanding scholarly journal articles, citation assistance, and much more! Most classes have a [research guide](#) already available with helpful subject-specific library databases and other resources.

Students can request one-on-one research assistance sessions through [Book-a-Librarian](#) (though you are always welcome to just come into the library and ask questions as needed).

Read More Things... Online!



[Dogwood Digital](#) is our new collection of ebooks and audiobooks available on your phone or device. Access on your computer or use the Libby app to seamlessly download the books to your device. Just add Dogwood Digital Library to Your Libraries, select Durham Tech as your "branch," then use Durham Tech username and password as your "library card."

Once it's set up, you'll have access to fiction and nonfiction (often with a shorter wait list than the public library).

Need a place to study?

The Main Campus Library has some options for you! All private study rooms have individual air purifiers and all library spaces have access to antibacterial wipes. White boards are available for use; ask for dry erase markers at the Circulation desk.

Quiet Study: The Quiet Room is for silent individual study. There are three smaller, private quiet rooms that can be checked out for use at the front desk.

Group Study: There are four group study rooms available for checkout, including two larger rooms and two smaller rooms. Smaller rooms can be used for audio recording or video conferencing. All of the rooms can be checked out at the front desk.

Upstairs Computer Lab: The Main Campus has a PC lab available. Students can complete school work and print. The lab has scanners available.

Downstairs Open Group Study Area: The downstairs group study area does not require a reservation and is available for groups and individuals who may not require silence to study.

Upstairs and Downstairs Study Carrels: Study carrels do not need a reservation and are for quiet individual study.

The **Northern Durham Center** and **Orange County Campus Libraries** do not have study rooms available, but do have computers, printing, and study spaces available for quiet study.
